NetWork Kansas Awards \$457,250 in Tax Credits To Nine Kansas Communities to Raise Funds to Loan to Local Entrepreneurs

NetWork Kansas announced November 6, 2012 that it has awarded \$457,250 in tax cred-its to nine Kansas Entrepreneurship (E) Com-munities, enabling them to raise more than \$600,000 to replenish local loan funds to be utilized by local businesses in their community. The selected communities are Chattauqua County, Coftey County, Hoising-ton, Leavenworth, McTherson County, Norton County, Ostass' innovative E-Community Partnership for at least one year and have ac-tively used their previously awarded funds to loan to local businesses.

All of the communities selected to receive ad-ditional funding submitted partnership pro-posals in August as part of a competitive 2012 E-Community selection process before being recommended to the NetWork Kansas board of directors for approval by Director of E-Com-munities Erik Pedersen.

"It is very exciting that nine of our existing En-trepreneurship Communities were selected to receive additional tax credits," said Pedersen. "Loan activity is certainly an important factor that we look for. However, it's the other initia-tives these communities are working on that truly effect the entrepreneurial environment in a positive manner."

Eight new E-Communities were also selected this fall. Combined, the new and existing E-Communities will raise more than \$1.5 million in seed funding for Kansas entrepreneurs this



The E-Community Partnership, now in its sixth year, has grown from six communities in 2007 to thirly-eight in 2012. Since 2007, NetWork Kansas E-Communities have loaned or granted \$2.1 million to busi-nesses in their communities through this fund-ing source and leveraged an additional \$1.19 million dollars, ifor a total investment of \$4.4 mil-lion dollars into businesses in E-Communities. This funding has spurred the creation or re-tention of nearly \$51 jubs in these same com-munities and has immeasurable positive effects on the entrepreneurial ecosystems of these participating areas.


