2012 Leadership McPherson Class **Announce Project**

To develop care packs for McPherson County youth who are removed from their homes in emergency situations is the mission of the 2012 Leadership McPherson Class. Members of this year's class presented their class project. Mac Care Packs, to the McPherson Chamber of Commerce Board of Trustess, Chamber members and guests at the class 'Celebration Lunch held Tuesday November 13 at The Best Mestern Tuesday, November 13 at The Best Western Holiday Manor Convention Center. The lunch marked the completion of the class' leadership curriculum offered by the McPherson Chamber of Commerce that began this past summer.

Each year the Leadership McPherson class is tasked with forming a project that will ultimately benefit the youth of McPherson timately benefit the youth of McPherson County. Through community research and county contacts, the 10 members of the 2012 Leadership McPherson Class learned that approximately 60 children (across multiple demographics and for varying reasons) in McPherson County are removed from their homes because of emergency situations each year. These children are then processed by local officials and either sent with extended family members or to emergency foster care out of area.

The processing of the children can mean hours of uncertainty, often with nothing for them to do except dwell on the situation.

These children most likely are hungry, bored, lonely and scared. As a result of these findings, the class developed the concept of Mac Care Packs.

"It is our vision to provide comfort to these "It is our vision to provide comfort to these children in the hours of uncertainty between the emergency and foster care by giving them a back pack with basic comfort items included." said Scott Barkley, member of the 2012 Leadership McPherson Class and NCRA employee. Other class members demonstrated to attendees at the November function that the packs will contain are ampropriate items. packs will contain age appropriate items such as a journal, a coloring book with crayons, a bottle of water, a snack, a puzzle or hands-on game and a stuffed animal. Members of the 2012 Leadership Class are

now accepting donations for these care packs. The group has begun an effort to es tablish a long-term fund with the McPherson County Community Foundation. Checks, corporate matches or other gifts Checks, corporate matches or other gifts can be made payable to the Foundation at 206 S. Main, McPherson, in care of Mac Care Packs. In the near future, the class will organize item donation drives throughout the community in hopes of filling packs for January distribution.

nation I have been in-trigued by the story of a New York police offi-cer assisting a home-

cer assisting a home-less person by gitting him with a pair of boots. A photo taken by a tourist quickly went viral after being posted on the inter-net. The photo highlighted the officer's compassion as he knelt next to the man sitting barefoot on the busy street side.

Several days later sources revealed the Several days later sources revealed the man was not homeless. He had access to an apartment in the Bronx that was paid for with rent vouchers, social security and military veteran benefits. Family members confirmed the man was a veteran who over the years had refused assistance

I was astounded by the comments posted on Facebook and throughout public media. Do homeless people deliberately chose a lifestyle of emptiness? Do the homeless abuse: "the system" to meet their needs? Are homeless abelters really making a difference? Are we as society being conned by the homeless?

These are complex questions with even more complicated answers. I appreciate the discussions that have evolved related to this photo. But I am also saddened to think one incident has caused us to doubt whether or not there is a need to assist others experiencing hardship.

For me the most powerful part of this story is the police officer's willingness to act upon impulse. He sensed there was a need, and he responded with the spirit of compassion. Whether in New York City or McPherson County, random acts of kindness bring hope for a better world. What better lesson can we learn?
