Central Kansas Conservancy is a non-profit 501(c) (3) organization. Their focus is to develop rail banked railways into recreational trails. These trails are used for walking, jogging, biking and horseback riding. They have the right of way to two rail banked trails. The first is the Mead-owlark Trail which runs approximately 124 miles between McPherson and Lindsborg. The other is the Sunflower Santa Fe trail which runs from J1th Av-enue in McPherson to Marion.

The Meadowlark trail has 4 miles covered with limestone screenings starting at the McPherson side (intersection of Moc-casin and Old 81 Highway) going north to Pawnee. These screenings make a pice Pawnee. These screenings make a nice surface for walking, jogging, biking, etc. The Sunflower Santa Fe trail has three quarters of a mile covered with screen-ings from the center of Galva going west towards McPherson. There is also a mile east of Galva cleared and ready for lime-stone screenings.


