On July 1, the state sales tax rate decreased from 6.3 to 6.15 percent, therefore making the City of McPherson sales tax rate to 8.15%. The Department of Revenue sent out postcards alerting retailers of the change, posted the information on its website and posted a re-minder on the sales tax payment portal which is used by 94% of all retailers.
