From the McPherson Chamber of Commerce



For the history buffs – I have dug up through more of the Chamber history.

1935

- Plans were discussed on how to pay proper recognition for the Globe Refinery Basketball team. The Chamber organized an "Oil Nite" of entertainment and dancing for members, their wives, oil men and their wives or ladv friends. (This is exactly how it was written in the minute book).
- Derby Oil Company refinery
- prospect had been contacted ■ The McPherson Chamber of Commerce office was also the Federal Government Re-employment office.

1936

- Contacts had been made with several brick companies
- Worked with a prospect Hardy Creamery – a cheese company

1937

■ The matter of the necessity of McPherson having a municipal swimming pool by next summer as well as the need of a band shell - a committee was appointed to research.

1938

- Worked with the Wichita Chamber of Commerce to establish a Kansas 81 Highway Associ-
- Work begun on establishing a City Hostess program
- It was suggested to add to the appearance of Main Street - get

permission from owners of vacant building to use their storefronts for advertising local products

- Worked with prospect Imperial **Brewing Company**
- Established the Community Calendar
- A push for home industry

■ The Chamber was in charge of the truck routing in McPherson due to the gasoline transport fire

1940 ■ Began work on establishing a

National Guard unit in McPher-

son 1941 ■ The Chamber sponsored a

County Food Stamp Plan

- 1942 ■ Worked with Washington regarding Navy Air Strip and air sites. A representative - Mrs. Shirk traveled to Washington to make contact with Judge Advocate General of the Navy and the Site Selection Board. After returning, Mrs. Shirk suggested that McPherson purchase 1,600 acres of land and give to Navy.
- Discussion of the need for a Community Chest (now it is the United Way)

1943

■ Discussion on the need for housing for personnel of Camp Phillips. (I believe this is located just north of Lindsborg on Burma Road)

1944

- Chamber representatives met with Veterans Administration to view hospital sites.
- References to 4-H Club picnic that the Chamber was in charge of - Chamber and 4-H have partnered for 72 years
- Received notification of a farm implement company interested in McPherson
- Coronet Manufacturing looking to locate in McPherson

- Additional industry prospects were contacted - Wrigley Gum, Eversharp Pencil, two railroads and two tire companies
- The Chamber took on the responsibility of raising a voluntary industrial fund to at least match the tax levy revenue
- Hainke Foundry prospect was contacted
- Home Building Corporation- a prefabrication home company was contacted

1946

- Many industry projects became "bottlenecked" due to the lack of housing
- Recommendation was sent to the City to enforce the 2 hour parking in order to relieve the parking problem
- Chamber made proposals to the City/County regarding building a 4-H building in the Athletic Park with an increase of mill levy. The bond was passed and the Chamber Ag Committee was in charge of raising additional funds for the building.
- Worked with Rock Island Depot
- Discussion of plans for the Diamond Jubilee Celebration

1947

- Prospect Hall Brothers plant - it was reported that 54 applications had been made to date in response to the company and that the company was not satisfied with this return. The company has surveyed other communities seeking what their labor supply
- Representatives of the McPherson Broadcasting Company presented their plans to establish a radio broadcasting station
- The Chamber voted to contribute \$25 for the Citywide Halloween Party

■ Consolidation of the two airports was discussed

In addition to the keynote speaker, the Ag Committee has chosen the honorees for the 2017 Farm Family of the Year and 2017 Friend of Agriculture who will be announced later. The honorees will be recognized during the buffet breakfast.

Chamber Now Accepting Ag Scholarship Applications

The McPherson Chamber of Commerce is collaborating with Agriculture Future of America (AFA) to support an agricultural scholarship program. AFA is a 501(c)3 corporation dedicated to helping support higher education and leader development of future agriculture producers and rural business leaders.

The Agriculture Committee of the McPherson Chamber of Commerce is raising funds for McPherson County students. AFA will leverage county fundraising efforts by soliciting corporations and foundations to provide financial resources to match community dollars. Since 1996, AFA's partnerships have awarded more than \$9 million in academic scholarship, provided leader training to nearly 13,000 students and young professionals. In McPherson County, the McPherson Chamber of Commerce Agriculture Committee has invested nearly \$60,000 providing 23 scholarships and \$13,000 has been awarded to 13 students for leadership conference tuition.

The AFA Leaders and Academic is \$4,200, consisting of a \$3,200 academic scholarship. The additional \$1,000 will sponsor a McPherson County recipient to the AFA Leaders Conference in Kansas City in November of the scholarship year.

Eligibility requirements for the McPherson Chamber of Commerce AFA Community Scholarship include any high school seniors enrolling in an accredited college of agriculture. They must be a resident of the McPherson County or student enrolled in a McPherson County school. The scholarship application is available at www.agfuture.org/scholarships

AFA, founded in the fall of 1996 by the late R. Crosby Kemper Jr., is headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri. In addition to enhancing the education and leader potential of rural youth in the Midwest region through community-based scholarships, AFA provides leader and career development training and internship assistance to college students across the country.
