Kansas Ranked Fifth Most **Business Friendly State**

Kansas has been named the fifth most business-friendly state in the nation in a survey by Pollina Corporate Real Es-tate, an influential site selec-

tion firm. The study ranks states based on 32 factors controlled by state government. The state has ranked in the top 10 since 2008 and was ranked fifth in 2014.
