#### Discovering Historic Sites in McPherson

The journey begins at the McPherson County Courthouse located at 117 N. Maple. Built in 1867, the Courthouse is a classic example of 19th Century Architecture style. Visitors are greeted on the west lawn by a bronze equestrian statue of General James Birdseye McPherson, for whom the city is named. He was one of the highest ranking Union officers to die during the Civil War.

Continue the journey to the McPherson Opera house at 219 S. Main. Built in 1888, the theater has lavish features which include the grand ballroom and a beautiful painted proscenium arch. The original auditorium seated 900

Here one will discover the historical people, places and endeavors of McPherson, Kansas. Encounter the first visible synthetic diamond created by McPherson College Professor Dr. J. Willard Hershey. Admire a collection of Birger Sandzen prints, lithographs and oils. View items from the McPherson Globe Refiners basketball team, the first team ever to win an Olympic gold medal. Stop by today and view the K is for Kansas Exhibit. This hands on educational exhibit will be on dis-play through April.
