Eligibility requirements for the McPherson County Scholarship include any high school seniors enrolling in an accredited college of agri-culture. They must be a resident of McPherson

County. Each scholarship has two components — leader and academic. The leader portion introduces recipients to AFA's leader development program through a \$1,000 sponsorship to the AFA Lead-ers Conference, a development experience for elite agriculture students, which is scheduled at 620-241-3303. November 3-6, 2016 in

Kansas City. The acarecipient's tuition and fees upon successful at-

tendance of Conference. Scholarship recipients from across the country are selected based on caer vision and goal leader and com involvement; and finan-cial need. Eligibility requirements vary, but all students must be pursu-ing four-year degrees in agriculture-related fields. Applications are due March 18, 2016.
