A Need to Toot Our Own Horn!

In 2004 NetWork Kansas was created due to the Economic Growth Act. Each year NetWork Kansas raises capital through an entrepreneurship tax credit up to \$2 million per year to sup-port "entrepreneurship communities" with a pool of loan funds. The McPherson Chamber of Commerce applied for the designation and was awarded in 2010 on be-half of McPherson County, meaning any business is eligible if located in McPherson County. NetWork Kansas started with six "entrepreneurship communi-ties" and is now up to 55. "NetWork Kansas and the local banks have proven to be a valuable partner in many of McPherson's storefronts," states Jennifer Burch, Executive Director of the McPher-son Chamber of Commerce. "We have funded 29 business start-up/ex-pansions amounting to \$930,463 with a project

total of \$4.674.725 creat-

A great example of eco nomic development is the \$4.6 million which repre-sents the initial project total, but does not take in account the increase in value that has been added due to renovations that have taken place on man of the buildings the busi-nesses are located. When you factor in the increased value of the building and the tax rev enue that these businesses are producing, that in itself is an asset. While these businesses generate tax revenue with their sales, they are also creating business for oth-ers with the needs of services such as; electric ity, gas, internet, cable, phone, insurance, ac-counting, banking, etc. There is a domino effect that takes place when a business opens their doors. The E-Loan pro gram is a prized example of economic development at work.

Shopping Local Is More Affordable Than You Think

Most people agree shopping local is a good ideas but some say they can't af-ford to pay more for items they need on a daily basis. Shopping local isn't more expensive if you take into ac-count the following aspects.

Box stores run expensive ads featur-ing loss leaders to get you in the doors. These products are sold at reduce revenue, or loss, in order to attract cus-tomers. The box stores sacrifice money on some items in the hopes you'll buy others. While some savvy shoppers come in just for the loss lead-ers, most do all their shopping at the store making up for the revenue lost on 1-2 items.

Cost of Fuel
If you're driving 20+ miles to go to a box store or mail, you're using about a gallon of gas each way, which adds be-tween \$3-\$5 (depending on the fuel prices) to what you are purchasing.

Local Revenue

If no one shops in your community, your businesses will close. If your businesses close, you lose revenue from shopping tourists, your tax base (which goes to fund schools, EMT, fire department, law enforcement, library and many others), and your little league sponsor. Are you willing to shell out the money to replace the revenue lost? People don't want to live in a town where everything is boarded up.
