A Maker Space is a collaborative work space inside a school, library or separate public/ private facility for making, learning, exploring and sharing using high tech or no tech tools. These spaces are open to kids, adults and entrepreneurs and have a variety of equipment including 3D printers, laser cutters, CNC machines, soldering irons and even sewing machines.





response thanking them for their text and asking how we can help them.
