About 20 McPhersonites traveled to Wichita to tour MakeICT, located at 1500 E. Douglas. MakeICT started as a small coffee group in 2012 that began hosting community events to build interest and support of their concept. In 2013 they incorporated and registered in the State of Kansas. They received their 501(c)(3) designation.

They outgrew two previous locations and as a result of the need of space for the increasing number of members, they were able to locate in the 8,700 square foot building on Douglas. Every imaginable tool to create, explore, invent, and experiment with is all under one roof. The space has designated "labs" for laser and 3D printers, ceramics, jewelry making, electronics, textiles, woodshop, metal shop with plasma/ weld, CNC mill and manual lathes.

MakeICT is supported by the 400 members who pay \$25 a month. Each member must attend an orientation, sign a waiver and must be authorized on specific areas only. Training and access to some equipment is required by an electronic key, which also allows 24-7 access to the building.

It may be one of the most challenging volunteer assignments you'll ever take on. It may also be one of the most rewarding in making a difference in the life of a child.

We're talking about CASAs - Court Appointed Special Advocates. This movement was born in 1977, when a Seattle judge determined he wasn't getting enough information to determine what was in the best interests of abused and neglected children coming through the court system. He recruited volunteers who gathered information to advocate for a child's best interests.

Sandra Bradley is the Executive Director for CASA in Harvey and McPherson Counties. She recruits and trains local volunteers.

a commitment: 30 hours, primarily in a classroom setting, as well as time in the courtroom. "We're looking for people who have a passion and a heart to help children," she said. "They need to keep an open mind; to leave their preconceived notions at the door." That's because the families involved have challenges like poverty, drug abuse, or domestic violence that affect the child's safety. "The child is the focus," said Bradley. The CASA gathers information, through visits and phone calls, from family, case workers and others who have involvement with the child. When Child In Need of Care cases (CINC) as they are known come to the

enough volunteers to serve at least 24 children. Most CASAs will handle one or two cases at a time. And each case can go on for 1, 2 or even more years until the best result for the child can be provided. The CASA also helps ensure that the desires of the child are considered.

Requirements to be a CASA are:

- Be at least 21 years of age
- No felonies or criminal history
- A high school gradu-
- ate or have their GED ■ Successfully complete a background
- Successful completion of the 30-hour CASA training


