Workforce Development

Availability of a trained and competent workforce is the number one economic issue facing Kansas. The Coalition contends it is critical that the State work with employers to develop creative approaches to workforce development and talent attraction and that it devote greater, more focused attention and resources to high education, career technical training and certification and further collaboration among all the relevant stakeholders (K-12, high education, early childhood education providers, technical educators, community colleges and the business community) in the area of workforce training.

Age: An Issue of Mind Over Matter

As one who is approaching the age of Social Security eligibility, my mind turns to our excellent network of senior centers in McPherson County.

The McPherson County Council on Aging provides an array of services to support senior centers and keep them strong. Senior centers play an important role in the lifeblood of a community. Terry Bolte, MCCA Director, said the centers "help keep seniors healthy, and their minds sharp." Senior centers offer a wide variety of opportunities, such as exercise and food programs, to help older

citizens stay active and engaged.

Bolte said, "Baby boomers don't want to admit they're in that bracket," but life circumstances like the loss of a spouse may bring an older person to a senior center to avoid isolation and depression. Senior centers are a key place for socialization, education, entertainment and health checks like foot care or blood pressure checks.

The Council on Aging also secures grants to fund affordable public bus transportation in McPherson, Lindsborg, Moundridge and Inman. This helps remove barriers for seniors to get around if they can't afford a vehicle or are no longer able to drive.

When you give to the United Way, you are helping senior centers throughout the county. I'd like to take a

moment to recognize our senior centers and their directors: Annette Otte in Canton; Debra Wolf in Galva, Charleen Thomas in Inman; Marian Lindshield in Lindsborg; Rita Brown in Marquette; Sondra Frank in McPherson; Pat Krehbiel in Moundridge; Krys Jensen, Senior Services Coordinator in Roxbury, and Bert Long in Windom. And there are many more volunteers in each community supporting senior services.

Bolte would like to see more people check out their local senior center and see what they have to offer. She admits, however: "We have 90year olds who say they're not old enough to go to the senior center."

Mark Twain perhaps summed it up best: "Age is an issue of mind over matter. If you don't mind, it doesn't matter."
