2019 Leadership McPherson Class Using Their Skills to Help with Youth Leadership Camp

Leadership McPherson is a professional program of the McPherson Chamber of Commerce to develop effective leaders, open minds to perspectives that surround issues facing our community and enable participants to become more visionary leaders. It motivates graduates to apply their new skills to move organizations and businesses forward.

Each year the Leadership McPherson Class champions a project to benefit the youth in the McPherson County area. The 2019 Class took the opportunity to be a part of a new Leadership Camp after being approached by Kari Moddelmog, Counselor at Eisenhower Elementary. The camp was put on by STUCO organizations in various McPherson schools and the 2019 Leadership McPherson Class facilitated the first day. Three different leadership areas were addressed: Teamwork/Communication, Finance, and Healthy Eating/Lifestyles. To gain a better understanding of each of these areas, students participated in activities, requiring them to use good communication skills and wise choices.

The "Spider Web" activity, consisted of a "spider web" like course with low ropes that the students had to maneuver through. The desired outcome was to get the whole team across to the other side of the web. The challenge was that once a certain hole in the spider web was used by one team member, it could no longer be used. Good communication and strategies allowed them to get their whole team safely across to the other side!

The "Ants on a Log" activity had the students lining up tallest to shortest on a 4x4 board. The challenge presented to them was to rearrange themselves shortest to tallest, without stepping off the board. If someone stepped off the board, they had to start over. Again, good communication and strategizing allowed them to achieve their goal.

During the Healthy Eating/Lifestyles activity the group got to make a healthy snack and smoothie, as well as taking home some healthy recipes to try. The students found that eating healthy is not really as bad as they thought. They discovered that healthy eating caused them to have more energy and focus, and that choosing a healthy lifestyle would affect their life.

Another activity that addressed Teamwork/Communication was done in cooperation with the McPherson Fire Department and McPherson Police Department. The challenge was for the students, as a group, to build a pulley system strong enough to move a police car or a fire truck. Each group was successful in completing the task and were able to move one of the vehicles!

The Leadership Class project was successful. The students worked well together through good communication and strategizing, were engaged throughout the morning, and really enjoyed the activities!

READY TO READ WITH DOLLY!

United Way is excited to launch the Dolly Parton Imagination Library for the children and families of McPherson County! We are nearing the time when children can be enrolled. Free books come to the child's house once a month. Children who live in McPherson County are eligible from the time they are born, and the books end with a child's 5th birthday. The books are age-appropriate, so as a child grows, they receive books with new words and concepts. The first book from the Imagination Library for all children is "The Little Engine That Could." We know that reading to children helps them become readers. As my wife, a former teacher said, "Life is so much easier for early readers." She saw the difference in

students who knew how to read entering kindergarten. Research shows that if a child is reading at grade level by 3rd or 4th grade, their chances of graduating from high school are much greater. So let's talk about how this program works. Dolly Parton has paid for the infrastructure to be set up for managing the book distribution in her home state of Tennessee. All of the books are mailed from there. When a family enrolls a child, the books don't come right away. It takes about 8-10 weeks to get a child on the list and into the distribution network. The actual books are paid for by us - the people who live and work here. United Way is serving as the local champion for the Imagination Library and raising the money to make the program possible. We need about \$35,000 - \$40,000 annually to pay for the Imagination Library. Right now, we are receiving donations

from individuals and businesses to make the program happen. It costs \$25 a year to send a book once-amonth to a child. Or you or your business can become a sponsor of several children. Here are our sponsorship levels: \$100 makes you a "Book-worm." You're a "Page Turner" at \$250; "Story Teller" is the \$500 level and for \$1,000 and up you can be a "Master Librarian."
