SPARK Grants Available

The McPherson County Community Foundation is working with McPherson County to administer SPARK (Strengthening People and Revitalizing Kansas) funds in the recovery of the effects from the COVID-19 pandemic. Small businesses and nonprofit organizations in McPherson County are eligible to receive funding through this program.

Grants of up to \$25,000 to eligible nonprofit organizations. The amount of a grant is to reimburse for costs and loss of income due to reduced donations or cancelled fund-raising events. The total funds available under this grant program are \$200,000.

Grants of up to \$10,000 to eligible small for-profit businesses. The amount of a grant is to reimburse for costs and loss of income due to the business interruption impact of COVID-19. The total funds available under this grant program are \$300,000.00.

A third component of the SPARK grants administered by the Foundation are focused on assistance for individuals and families to pay rent/mortgage or utilities as a result of lost wages from layoffs, reduced hours or being furloughed after March 13, 2020.

ROB MACKEY **Executive Director COVID-19 COMPOUNDS** THE CRISIS OF DOMESTIC **VIOLENCE**

Domestic Violence was already a sobering societal issue, and then COVID-19 came along. October is National Domes-

tic Violence Awareness Month and it's an opportunity for all of us to be informed. Kim Ratzlaff, Executive Director of Safehope, says more than 69,000 Kansans sought refuge from domestic violence situations in 2019.

Safehope, which services Harvey, Marion, and McPherson Counties, served 926 clients in the year ending June 30th. "So it's not like we're just talking about a few people that deal with violence in their homes with their spouse or their partners," said Ratzlaff. "It is a big concern that we're dealing with every

Safehope operates a residential shelter in Newton and provides a 24hour hotline for people in crisis. "It's just important," said Ratzlaff, "that we're there to listen and care and to help our clients find their own solutions."

Safehope is a partner agency of United Way of McPherson County. Our funding helps make a local office possible and fund a storage unit for community donations. Because victims often flee their situations with few personal possessions, Safehope can begin to provide the donated household items they need to set up a

Safehope's advocates report that the pandemic has been a gamechanger for their work. "It's been much more complicated for our victims and survivors," said Ratzlaff. "They maybe can't get out of the home as easily, because now the perpetrator, if you will, is still in the house working from home. So, maybe the mother can't get out of the home with the children in a safe manner. And even when they do, having to deal with the new school schedules and the daycare arrangement, COVID has impacted the lives of all of us. It has compounded the impact on the lives of victims who are trying to put their lives back

Support and counseling are important parts of their services, and they have two part-time licensed therapists that are part of their counseling that can be included. Men can also be domestic violence victims, and Safehope is available to them, as

If you or someone you know is in crisis from domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking, call the hotline at 316-283-0350. It is answered 24-hours a day. More information on Safehope is available on their website at www.safehope.net. Our thanks to Kim, her staff and the agency's volunteers that provide vital services to people who desperately need them.
