President's Award Honoree Revealed

Each year the past presidents of the McPherson Chamber choose the recipient of this award. The criteria being "a person who has given of his/ her time and talent for the betterment of the business community, and whose contributions are readily identifiable and have a long-term impact." Congratulations Dr. Michael Schneider!

Michael Schneider started his first enterprise at age 7 – a museum in his bedroom. The museum ultimately closed its doors to the public. But years later one of the collections on display – namely, (36) 1984 Topps Mark McGuire Olympic rookie cards – helped fund Michael's education at McPherson College, where he graduated with honors in 1996.

Michael got his early career break when the partners at Summit Publishing invited him to run the company. He was only halfway through his 20s when he found himself leading a company into the electronic commerce era. His list of life adventures has included earning an MBA from the University of Denver, doctorate from the University of Pennsylvania and supporting startups in everything from information technology to green energy.

In 2002, Michael's alma mater called him to return, and he made the decision to answer that invitation. He has moved through a list of key positions at McPherson College, helping spearhead increased giving to the college and enrollment numbers now at all-time highs. McPherson College also boasts one of the largest endowments of any private college in Kansas.

Michael's passionate vision to lift up liberal arts through an entrepreneurial mindset has sparked the imagination of the entire campus. McPherson's commitment to debt free education and post-graduation placement rates is an important part of the student experience. During his tenure, job and graduate school placement rates have led the nation; while average debt per student at graduation has dropped by nearly \$8,000. From niche degree programs in automotive restoration to rural healthcare management, McPherson is reinventing itself as a significant contributor in higher education.

Since becoming president in 2009, Michael has served the higher education community as board chair of the Associated Colleges of Central Kansas and Kansas Campus Compact; executive committee officer of the Kansas Independent College Association; board member of the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities and Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference; and national advisory board member for Future Business Leaders of America and Distributive Education Clubs of America, .

His contributions since 2002 have rippled out into the greater McPherson Community as McPherson College has added over fifty new jobs and hundreds of new students who boost the local economy. Many graduates start their careers in McPherson because of the career oriented liberal arts program he designed in 2003, which leads to nearly every student completing multiple internships—many within the McPherson community. One of his favorite accomplishments includes six consecutive years of McPherson College named by the Chronicle of Higher Education as one of their "Great Colleges to Work For" with recognition in more categories than any other college in the country. Highlights from his past service in the community includes serving as a board member of the McPherson Chamber of Commerce; member of the McPherson Industrial Workforce Enhancement Committee; president of the McPherson Community Education Foundation; and graduate of Leadership McPherson.

Michael and his wife Kandee, who is also a McPherson College graduate, value their life in McPherson. They are proudest of their two daughter's Hayden and Perrin.

We Can Help You Start a New **Business in McPherson County**

The McPherson County E-Community Loan program is available for business start-ups or expansions. It was created through the Kansas Center for Entrepreneurship Tax Credit Program and Nework Kansas. The McPherson Chamber of Commerce administers the program to assist in the economic growth of our community. The purpose of the E-Community program is to provide low inter-

est loans to entrepreneurs wishing to start, purchase or expand a business in McPherson County. The loans are to be used in partnership with a financial institution and/or a Network Kansas partner as the "final piece" of financing a business start-up or expansion. To utilize the maximum 40% available from the E-Community Loan

Fund, there is a 60% match required from either a bank or a Network Kansas Fund Partner. The minimum loan request is \$5,000 and the maximum is \$45,000. Funding is subject to a 1% below prime rate and loan terms can be 12-120 months. Length will be determined by the amount borrowed.

STEPMC - BUILDING BRIDGES **OUT OF POVERTY**

COVID-19 has thrown many of us economic curve balls. But for Austin Regier, Executive Director of STEPMC (Steps to End Poverty in McPherson County), many of the people his organization works with already knew many of the social service supports available to them.

When the pandemic hit, they did better than most of those who were suddenly out of work and trying to understand what's out there to get them through tough times.

In a recent interview with Kena Dacus, United Way of McPherson County Board Member and Communications Chair, Regier explained the program: "STEPMC works to walk alongside people until they overcome poverty. We do that by forming relationships with people. So we serve all of McPherson County, and are really just looking to build relationships across economic lines," said Austin. STEPMC relies on volunteers not in poverty to provide intentional friendships to those enrolled with STEPMC. That means educating the volunteers. One way they do that is through Bridges Out of Poverty. Regier explains: "Bridges Out of Poverty is a training for people who are not in poverty, who want to learn a little bit more about what poverty actually looks like in our community.

We typically hold a lot of misconceptions about poverty, and don't really understand what it looks like. So this is an opportunity for people to learn what poverty actually looks

There are lots of opportunities to volunteer with STEPMC, said

Regier. "People can cook a meal for us, we meet each week, and have a meal together. You can also help with our youth program, you can donate a vehicle that you're maybe looking to pass on to somebody. And then of course, you can always become a partner, which is an intentional friend to somebody in poverty." For people who like to see results, STEPMC delivers, said Regier. "On average," he said, "people can almost triple their income when they come through the program. I can tell you that program participants have paid off a total of more than \$150,000 in debt, or have increased their housing or their education levels when they come through our

Regier went on to share these examples: "We had a single mom who was just really stuck in a rut when she came to us. And now she's building herself a house, and she's going to college and has a 4.0 GPA and is really moving up in her work. We have somebody in Smoky Valley, who is a dispatcher. And we found out earlier this year that she is now above 250% of the federal poverty guidelines and is able to provide a lot more for her family. Coming through STEPMC, we're able to walk alongside people, and really uncover

some of that potential they have." In addition to McPherson, there are also programs located in Lindsborg and Moundridge, to help serve the entire county. To learn more or to volunteer, contact STEPMC at 620-241-9011 or email director@ stepmc.org.
