100 Years Strong

May 3rd, 2021 marks a very important day for the McPherson Chamber of Commerce as we celebrate I00 years of serving the McPherson community. We are proud of the many milestones and the impact the Chamber has made throughout the years, and we plan to celebrate for months to come. Be looking for snippets of our rich history, the visionary leaders and what they accomplished, and some fun photos we have discovered. As we celebrate the past, we also look to the future and what initiatives the Chamber will focus on for a better and stronger tomorrow. Thank you for being a part of our story!

Although some of our scope has evolved, other aspects of the original McPherson Chamber of Commerce charter hold true to this day. Enjoy this excerpt from the original 1921 Charter which states that the purposes for which it is formed are: "To promote the commercial and civic interests of the city of McPherson and advance its industries; to foster and encourage the development and promotion of new enterprises; extend its trade limits; develop the resources of the community; to buy, hold, and sell real estate and personal property; to do all other things common to the objects and purposes of commercial organizations; to cement a closer friendly feeling among the members of the association; to create a higher moral atmosphere within the community and to encourage a better understanding between the businessmen, the farmer and other citizens and inhabitants in and around the city of McPherson.'

Not Much Change in Office Locations

In searching for the original office location, which was not noted in the I92I charter, the only clue we found was in the early Chamber Board minutes. The minutes indicate that the board of directors met in the "Directors Room" in the late 1920's and mentioned they occasionally met at the McCourt Hotel in the 1930's. The McPherson Library history database shows the address of the McCourt Hotel (formerly the Union Hotel) was located at 201 N. Main from 1930-1947 then 104W Marlin in 1966) A side tidbit-The McCourt Hotel was owned by George McCourt, the first mayor or McPherson, KS who also owned the livery stable.

We did find a photo published in the 9/24/I954 Republican paper of the "new" office location for the McPherson Chamber of Commerce. The caption says "part of the new office quarters of the McPherson Chamber of Commerce in the new Price building in the I00 block on North Ash Street." (which is II8 N. Ash) "The offices have been equipped with modernistic and attractive furnishings."

After residing at II8 N. Ash for "slightly more than 25 years" records show that the McPherson Chamber then moved to 308 N. Main. (actually 306 N. Main). Newspaper article reads "ECCO, Inc. agreed to purchase the building and remodeled a portion of the facility to fit the needs of the Chamber. Work was completed in late 1977. The Chamber moved into the new facility in early December, 1977. And 306 N. Main is where you will still find us today! Come see us!

2021 AFA Scholarship Recipient Has Impressive Goals



Max Harman, a junior at Kansas State University, has been awarded the 2021 Agriculture Future of America (AFA) Scholarship for McPherson County! This scholarship is made possible by the McPherson Chamber of Commerce Ag Committee in partnership with Agriculture Future of America. The Agriculture Committee has raised funds to support the AFA Leader

and Academic Scholarship for McPherson County since 2000.

Max Harman will receive a \$3,200 AFA Academic Scholarship in addition to sponsoring his \$1250 AFA Leaders Conference fee. This event in Kansas City, Missouri, is attended by over 800 top agriculture students from across the nation each year.

When asked about his future goals, Max indicated that after he obtains his undergraduate degrees in Biochemistry and Global Food Systems

Leadership at Kansas State University, he intends to earn his Ph.D. in plant genetics at a premier agriculture/plant science institution. Further explaining his ideal career path, Max said "Using this foundation, I will research applications in biotechnology, particularly gene editing and CRISPR/Cas-9, to develop novel genetic traits in high-impact agricultural commodities. My long-term goal is to lead research and development efforts at one of the four premier global agriculture biotechnology companies." Max also hopes to "pursue projects directed toward alleviating mass-malnutrition and hunger in developing countries."

The Art of Aging

It takes about ten years to get used to how old you are. ~ Unknown

Aging can be a mystery. I guess it depends on whether you're paying attention. For many people life flashes by and then they wake up and realize, "I'm 28!" or "I'm 40!" or "I'm 64!" or "I'm 80...." Frankly, I marvel that I'm still here.

Through my work with United Way, I've learned of a wonderful resource that is focused on seniors — the McPherson County Council on Aging. Councils on aging were an outgrowth of the Older Americans Act in 1965. McPherson's was created in 1976 so they are turning 45 this year.

Council on Aging Executive Director Terry Bolte has managed the organization for nearly 8 years, after having led the Lindsborg Senior Center for a year.

With her accounting background, Bolte has helped hundreds of lower-income seniors with filing for property tax relief under the Kansas Homestead Act, obtaining assistance with utility bills through the Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) and doing tax returns.

The Council on Aging also writes annual grants to provide local bus transportation in the communities of Inman, Lindsborg, McPherson, and Moundridge, providing an important lifeline especially for those no longer able to drive.

An independent network of local senior centers throughout the county meet monthly to share the work they are doing to help seniors build self-reliance and provide a gathering place for older residents to build relationships. United Way provides operational financial assistance to the centers which is administered by the Council on Aging. The senior centers are places to access good nutrition, exercise and recreation, and educational opportunities. "They provide a good social network," said Bolte.

The centers also offer foot care and blood pressure clinics among other services.

What are seniors most concerned about? "They're worried about whether or not their retirement or their Social Security is going to last them as long as they need it. Medical services are a big worry. That's why people keep getting roped into these Advantage plans," said Bolte. The Council on Aging is a great resource for senior health insurance counseling.

It's fair to say the local senior centers are a lifeline. In Terry Bolte's words: "It just keeps them out and engaged and active, they take better interest in their community. I think it gives people a better sense of purpose and a place to go other than sitting in their four walls being bored."

Our thanks to Terry Bolte and Council of Aging staff member Cindy Rundle, and all of the senior center directors around the county and their volunteers who are helping us age well.
