Dandelion Digging Champs!

"Despite unfavorable weather conditions, the community picnic and dandelion digging contest of the City Federations' anti-dandelion program, staged yesterday, was a decided success. The parade was a great feature and put plenty of pep and ginger into the contestants. Rivalry was keen and the finish was close between the Chamber of Commerce and Rotary teams in the race for the big cake offered as a prize by the Rotary-Anns to the best diggers. This morning it was stated that 2500 pounds of dandelions were dug in the two parks by the contestants." - from a newspaper article dated 4/I4/I922.

Although cake sounds like a pretty good incentive, we are thankful for the beautiful parks maintained by our terrific park department crew, so that we don't have to dig dandelions anymore!

Making a Lasting Impression

William "Bill" Sheets was the first recipient of the "Man of the Year" award when it was started in 1966. (This picture was probably taken around 1978/1979 when Mr. Sheets was the Chamber President.) The Man of the Year was selected because of his contributions to the community and was honored during the Good-Will Trip sponsored by the McPherson Chamber of Commerce. The award was renamed in 1982 to the President's Award and still follows much of the same criteria as when it originated. The President's Award recipient, chosen by the past-presidents of the McPherson Chamber, is "a person who has given of his/her time and talent for the betterment of the business community and whose contributions have a long-term impact."

The McPherson County Entrepreneurship Community loan program was created through the Kansas Center for Entrepreneurship Tax Credit Program and Network Kansas. The program is administered by the McPherson Chamber of Commerce to provide low interest loans to entrepreneurs wishing to start, purchase or expand a business in McPherson County. The loans are to be used in partnership with a financial institution and/or a Network Kansas partner to fill the gap" of financing a business start-up or expansion. Funds can be used for equipment, inventory, real estate and working capital.

Since 2012, the E-Community Loan Program has approved 59 low interest loans, totaling over \$2,153,000! These Entrepreneurship Loans have also resulted in many added jobs and growth for our community!

School Supply Train & MMS Supply Closet

Shirley Adams, a life-long educator in McPherson, started the McPherson School Supply Train in 1994. Her experience in teaching showed her that many kids come to school with little or no supplies on their first day of school. It was her belief that every child should have new school supplies to start the year off regardless of ability to afford those supplies. Kindergarten through 5th grade students on the free and reduced meal plan are the primary recipients of the School Supply Train supplies. The School Supply Train has had many volunteers over the years and is currently led by Shirley's daughter, Marsha Silver.

Leadership McPherson is a professional development program of the McPherson Chamber of Commerce to develop effective leadership, open minds to perspectives that surround issues facing our community and enable participants to become more visionary leaders. Part of the class curriculum is a class project to benefit the youth of McPherson County. The 2020 Leadership McPherson Class originally wanted to provide school supplies for all of K-5 USD 418 students. After crunching the numbers, they soon realized this would have to be a goal to shoot for in the future. The Class learned about the McPherson School Supply Train and approached Marsha Silver with interest in assisting them in purchased supplies for students. Masha suggested that the Leadership Class take on the McPherson Middle School Supply Closet project. It was a brainchild of the volunteers at the time, but they had been unable to execute it because of the time needed to see it through.

Thus, the 2020 Leadership McPherson Class project narrowed their focus to the McPherson Middle School Supply Closet and will fill it with school supplies for 6th-8th graders. The teachers and counselors will always have access to the supplies and be able to provide what is needed by the students throughout the year. The initial purchase of supplies for the closet will be substantial, but in following years, it will only need to be replenished with what has been used.

Thanks to the McPherson Community, the 2020 Leadership McPherson Class has raised over \$7,000 to be used for the MMS Supply Closet. The class was excited to learn that another group has been raising funds for the same purpose. A group of volunteers from the First United Methodist Church in McPherson have raised \$6,000 for the Supply Closet. By combining their funds, they will be able to provide over \$13,000 to purchase supplies and have the Supply Closet ready at MMS before the start of the 2021-2022 school year. Collaboration at its best!

The United Way Triathlon Is Back!

The pandemic did a real number on nonprofits in 2020, especially those that rely on special events to help accomplish their missions. Not surprisingly, the coronavirus contributed to the mass cancellation of fundraising events. The United Way Triathlon was no exception after months of careful deliberation.

Fortunately, society is beginning to emerge from COVID-19. Virus numbers are down significantly, and our leadership decided the United Way Triathlon could safely return this year for a 13th run.

The event, to be held at McPherson Water Park Saturday, July 31st starting at 8 a.m., features separate competitions for both adults and youth. For the

16-year-old and over, they begin with a 200-meter swim followed by a 2-mile run and 7-mile bike on McPherson's east side. For the Junior Triathlon, the swim is 100 meters in addition to a .75 mile run and a 3-and-a-half-mile bike.

Registration is \$55 for adults, \$25 for youth. Three-member teams (with each member taking a leg of the race) are \$120 and youth teams are \$75. Go to www.unitedwaymcpherson.org to register.

The 2021 United Way Triathlon is led by Brandon Trost with Integrated Health and Wellness and a member of the United Way Board of Directors. Brandon himself has competed in our triathlon and similar events for years and we are very blessed to have him as our leader.
