The 202I YEC will be held at the McPherson Community
Building, I22 E. Marlin, on Wednesday, December 15th. Students from Chris
Strathman's MHS Entrepreneur Class will showcase
their business ideas and gain valuable experience "pitching" their business proposals.

The competition will consist of three parts, a written business plan called an executive summary, a tradeshow booth, and a 4-minute presentation. All three parts will be evaluated and scored by a panel of judges. The YEC competition will help students gain experience with organizational skills, business planning and public speaking.

The public is encouraged to attend the YEC between 9:00-II:00 am at the McPherson Community Building and visit with the students at their tradeshow booths. Your interest in their ideas will be refreshing for them. Your questions about their product or service will help them iron out key details, and your encouragement may be the boost they need to launch their business in McPherson!


business now or in the future, that's one more independent business impacting our community.

many people may be lonely or without much during the holidays, there are a lot of community angels at work. Many of them are a part of what is known as the McPherson County Christmas

The McPherson County Christmas

The McPherson County Resource Council was instrumental in bringing together several groups that were running programs to benefit people in need at Christmas. Christmas Project Coordinator Sharon Long has been involved since her arrival here in 2009. "A few years ago, we got all the organizations together," she said, "and decided that it would be beneficial to the residents who are in need if they didn't have to keep going to different places for help." Beneficiaries of the program go through a short interview confirming their eligibility (the program is limited to those whose income is at or below 150% of the poverty level).

Many people refer to this as the "Angel Tree," a Resource Council program to provide new clothing to children in need. But the Christmas Project encompasses so much more.

- Toys for Kids, an American Legion program to provide toys for children I2 and younger. Thanks to Teresa Rauh and all the helpers at the Legion.
- Gifts for Teens is operated by the McPherson Optimist Club. Jack Rader recruits many elves who do the shopping for youths ages 13 to 18.
- Food Baskets: Thanks to Olivia Fetsch and Denise O'Connor Munsey for taking the lead on this, and thanks to Connie Grennan for her support in past years.
- Quilts for Babies We appreciate Cheri Honchu and the many members
 of the McPherson Quilt Guild who work year-round to ensure warm, cozy
 quilts for babies.
- Books for Children And there's Kelsey Peterson, who raises the money to purchase books for kids on distribution day.

Community angels picked up tags at Emprise Bank, The Locker Room, McPherson County Co-op Credit Union, Rise Private Wealth Management and the Village Geek and went shopping to make sure there are presents under the tree for the youth. We appreciate their partnership in the Christmas Project.

Other shout outs go to Julie Holloway with Mt. Hope Sanctuary for securing Wal-Mart shoe and coat vouchers for the kids, Resource Council partner the McPherson County Council on Aging, and Kyle Buller and Jim Osland at Journey Church and the use of their building as a distribution center.

We couldn't make the Christmas Project happen without all this support. You do need a leader, and that is Sharon Long. She gives hundreds of volunteer hours to make sure that each year, as many people as possible are interviewed to confirm their eligibility. It's an amazing commitment by an amazing woman.

"I think it is a really great program," said our chief angel of the Christmas Project. "I am glad to see so many people in the county willing to help those in need. Because we usually have a lot of people step up to the plate and make financial donations and food donations and clothing donations. It's just neat. The whole county comes together for this each year."

Thank you, Sharon, for giving so much of yourself to help people in need. And Kristi Fowler with Horizon Real Estate Services is Sharon's very supportive employer, generously making the office available as a space for families to be interviewed.

We'd also like to thank to the team at Adams Brown who volunteered this year to help do interviews.

As part of the United Way, I've also been blessed to interview some of our I60 applicants, and they tell me they are very grateful for the help.
