story, but I won't be a book spoiler because I honestly haven't even finished it yet. I'm savoring it!

The main character, the Carpenter, is a mentor who guides others to realize that success comes by helping others and that it is essential to have the right attitude. "I just know that what you think, you become. I know that how you see the world determines the world you see and how the world see you. I know your perspective can take a bad situation and turn into a great outcome. I know a positive attitude not only draws people to you, but it also gives you power to overcome all the obstacles you will face

as you build your success."

The book also focuses on three success strategies. "Not all leaders love, serve, and care, but all who love, serve, and care are leaders."

"Always remember that great organizations that care are composed of people who care greatly-and it starts with you. Not because you are the leader of the company, but because one person who cares inspires everyone around them to care. Anyone in any organization can be CCO, Chief Caring Officer."

"Caring is the ultimate success building strategy. People make it complicated but it's simple: Care about the work you do. Surround yourself with people who care. Show your team you care about them. Build a team that cares about one another. Together show your customers you care about them."

This applies to making a difference at home as well. Another favorite message from the book is "I believe we are who we are because someone loved us. And your team and family will become who they become because you love them." Showing you care can take on several forms like little notes in your kid's lunch box. "He wanted to create the pathway to their future accomplishments, victories, and triumphs with the right belief system and so he wrote a positive message each day." Giving them the "gift of encouragement, optimism, and belief."

Applications Open For 2022 AFA Scholarship

Attention graduating high school seniors or undergraduate college students pursuing a four-year degree in an agriculture or food related field and reside in McPherson County and/or attend a high school in McPherson County. You are eligible to apply for the McPherson Chamber of Commerce AFA Scholarship.

The McPherson Chamber of Commerce Agriculture Committee established the local Agriculture Future of America (AFA) Scholarship in 2001 and has awarded 31 full academic and leader development scholarships, and 12 additional leadership conference only scholarships since then. The \$4,450 full scholarship includes a \$3,200 academic scholarship, and tuition to the AFA Leaders Conference (worth \$1,250).

AFA Scholarship recipients will be selected based on leadership roles in organizations, community service, internship and work experiences, and financial need. Recipients will also be scored on these three personal vision statements. I.) Explain your educational and ideal career path. 2.) What is one challenge you have had in the last year and how have you persevered through it? 3.) How would you describe the personal brand you hope to have in the food and agriculture community?

Selected scholars must commit to attend the AFA Leaders Conference in the fall semester of the awarded scholarship year, maintain full-time class status and remain in good academic standing with the institution to receive the academic scholarship.

On the Front Lines



ROB MACKEY Executive Director United Way of As we near two years of enduring the pandemic in the United States, I'd like to acknowledge the heroic efforts of United Way partner programs during these trying times.

United Way of McPherson County helps fund I7 programs that help local people in need in the areas of health, education and financial stability. The pandemic caused the staff and volunteers of these programs to adapt to different delivery systems. While most social services rely on human contact, our sponsored programs deftly crafted new strategies to stay operational.

Meals on Wheels is one of those programs. They deliver hot, well-balanced meals 365 days a year to homebound senior citizens and the disabled. They had to come up with ways to reduce contact, yet maintain it. They began using disposable food containers and instead of going into a person's house, took the meals to the porch, yet waited until the recipient emerged so the volunteer delivery person knew they were OK

The Lindsborg and Marquette Summer Lunch Programs went through similar challenges. Rather than sit down meals in a church, they developed drive-through lanes where families could pick up meals.

Steps to End Poverty in McPherson County (STEPMC), an anti-poverty program, went through several cycles of meeting in person to conducting its sessions via Zoom — even having "porch talks" in safe, socially distant encounters. It kept the contact going. On November 4th, STEPMC was able to hold in person ceremonies for four Getting Ahead graduates, and it was well-attended.

United Way fights for the health, education and financial stability for every person in McPherson County. Much of that mission is accomplished through the work of trained professionals and passionate volunteers who make it all happen. Much as boxers bob and weave to win a fight, these people have responded to this crisis by creatively coming with alternate ways to deliver services. They were already doing amazing work. Their tenacity to deliver in the face of COVID-19 is commendable and they are heroes in my book.

As we prepare to wrap up another United Way annual campaign, I salute the staff and volunteers of our partners:

CASA — A Voice for Children; CPRF (Cerebral Palsy Research Foundation); Child Care Aware; GraceMed; Heart to Heart Child Advocacy Center; Lindsborg and Marquette Summer Lunch Program; McPherson County Council on Aging; McPherson County Crime Stoppers; McPherson Family YMCA (Middle School Learning Lab, Safety Around Water, YKids) McPherson Housing Coalition and Brush Up Mac; McPherson Special Olympics, Meals on Wheels, Safehope, & STEPMC.
