Attract and Retain Top Talent with Chamber Blue of Kansas

The McPherson Chamber of Commerce is excited to announce that we are participating in a program that will help local business offer health insurance to employees, or potentially lower the health insurance costs of their current plans. We are partnering with the Chamber of Commerce Executives of Kansas (CCEKS) and Blue Cross and Bue Shield of Kansas to form the Chamber Blue of Kansas. This new association health plan will be available to all Chamber members in good standing and who employ two or more W2 employees.

Chamber Blue of Kansas takes the buying power of over 37 Chambers throughout the State of Kansas to create one large health insurance group. Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas (BCBSKS) estimates the group size could be between 3,000 and 6,000 policies making it one of the larger insurance groups in the state.

Chamber Blue of Kansas will help small, medium, and even larger businesses have the buying power of larger groups. This, in turn, will keep premium costs down, and better yet, BCBSKS is predicting lower year-to-year premium increases.

There will be several plans offered so employers can give their employees options when it comes to their health insurance. All price structures will be composite rated. A composite rate is an insurance premium based on the average risk profile of a group rather than the risk profile of an individual policyholder. This means that all members of the group pay the same insurance premium and that rate is not based on age or health history.

The first year is absolutely the best year to participate in this plan. In year 1, premiums will be based on a "simple demographic," meaning employers only have to submit their employee's name, date of birth, gender, and zip code. No health histories will be collected. If you wait till year 2 and beyond to enroll, employers will be rated on their health histories and can be denied entry into the group. This keeps the group "healthier" and stable.

An interest survey will be coming out in August 2022 and businesses must participate the survey to be eligible for enrollment. Those that participate in this survey will get to view the proposed plan rates in September 2022. Plan year will start January 1, 2023. You do not have to be a current McPherson Chamber of Commerce member to take the survey and view the rates, but you would have to join the Chamber in order to enroll in the plan. You are not obligated to accept the quote if the insurance does not fit your needs. If you choose to participate in the Chamber Blue of Kansas, Blue Cross will provide a dedicated account management team located right here in Kansas to help you implement the health plan. They will provide one-on-one support, training for your human resource staff, benefit assistance, and education for your employees.

The Chamber Blue of Kansas is focused on providing more value to business owners and their employees. With more health insurance plan options at competitive rates, you can provide rich benefits, helping attract and retain top talent.

The Rural Appreciation Picnic is a way we can celebrate our Agriculture producers and families for their contributions to our way of life. This information from the Kansas Agriculture 2022 in partnership with the Kansas Department of Agriculture gives just a glimpse of the impact of agriculture. "Kansas agriculture continues to be a vital force in the state's economy, bringing in dollars and providing many jobs. As the top industry in Kansas, agriculture accounts for over 40% of the total economy, and according to the most recent statistics, there are 58,300 farms in the state, producing and raising top crops and livestock. The Sunflower State's top commodities include cattle and calves, wheat, corn, sorghum, and soybeans. The state's nickname comes from another important crop, as Kansas ranks fourth in the nation in sunflower production."

The Rural Appreciation Picnic will coincide with the kickoff of the McPherson 4-H Fair on July 22. Attendees will have time to enjoy the 4-H

exhibits in the 4-H building and Chief Building before the picnic is served, then stay for a Live Food (dessert) Auction under the tent at 6pm, followed by the Meat Goat Show in the Livestock Arena at 7pm.

Reading and Running

In the last few weeks, I have been getting a better understanding of the programs and projects that the United Way of McPherson County and our partner agencies provide. One of the most important programs is the Dolly Parton Imagination Library.

We know there is a strong relationship between reading ability and academic success. I think of my own son Benjamin who is now 9 years old. His grades have always been "ok" but during the summer between 2nd and 3rd grade he developed a love of reading. This past spring, he was reading 3-4 chapter books a week. His grades were also much improved and generally he was more excited to go to school. This all relates to the Dolly Parton Imagination Library because according to a study in Tennessee (Dolly Parton's home state) children who received their books for at least three years scored an average of 10 points higher in language and reading, and 2 points higher in math on kindergarten readiness testing. There have been several other studies with similar but varied results.

Over the past 25 years the Imagination Library has donated over 160 million books to children under the age of 5. On a local level our United Way program has mailed out over 22,000 books

since 2019. An Each month Exe we mail tor, out books Mc to around 850 children

representing about half of children under the age of 5. Just think the impact we could have if we were able to reach 100% of the children.
