

With special emphasis on the period from 1870 to 1910, the museum includes two buildings on the National Registry of Historical Places and extensive archives and artifact collections. BIRGER SANDZÉN ART GALLERY

Born in Sweden, Sandzén was a prolific painter and printmaker, completing more than 2600 oil paintings and 500 watercolors in his lifetime. THE COLE HOUSE

405 E. Cole St., in Moundridge / 620-345-2427. The first house located in what is now Moundridge, began as a two-room two-story house with a lean-to kitchen in 1875. Tours of the Cole House are available, during which you'll hear stories and and experience the history of one family in Moundridge. Be sure to also visit the MOUNDRIDGE DEPOT MUSEUM. During the late 1800s the depot had four trains come through per day bringing passengers, mail, and freight, and it was a center of activity in Moundridge. The Moundridge Depot Museum is open by appointment only for tours.
